

**MINUTES OF
THE PRESBYTERY OF CAYUGA-SYRACUSE**

The Presbytery of Cayuga-Syracuse held a Stated Meeting on Saturday, May 17, 2014 at the First Presbyterian Church of Marcellus, New York. The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by the Moderator, teaching elder Steve Thomas, who opened with prayer.

At the request of the Moderator, the Stated Clerk affirmed that a quorum was present. The docket was adopted as amended.

The Moderator's first action, which he asked to be recorded in the minutes, was to turn the meeting over to the Vice-Moderator.

Upon approval of the Presbytery, teaching elder Allison Seed, regional representative of the Board of Pensions and member of Heartland Presbytery, was seated as a corresponding. First-time teaching elder members and ruling elder commissioners were introduced to the Presbytery.

It was moved and seconded to approve the minutes of the October 30, 2013 stated meeting of the Presbytery and the February 1, 2014 special meeting of the Presbytery.

The Presbytery gathered for the worship of God. During the worship service, the Moderator and Vice-Moderator of the Presbytery were installed to office. The following people were formally commissioned to special service: our commissioners to this year's General Assembly, along with our Young Adult Advisory Delegate to G.A., the new members of the Leadership Team, and the youth and adult participants in the upcoming Korean Mission Trip. Prayers of Thanksgiving were offered, including giving thanks for the lives of presbyters who died in 2013. (Their names are listed in Appendix A to these minutes.) The Sacrament of Communion was celebrated.

The Committee on Preparation for Ministry presented Mr. Mario Bolivar for examination for ordination. Mr. Bolivar is a candidate under the care of the Presbytery of Miami Valley, and has been certified ready to receive a call. He presented his Statement of Faith, and was examined by the Presbytery. It was moved and seconded to arrest the examination, and the motion was approved. Mr. Bolivar and his family were escorted out of the sanctuary. It was moved and seconded to sustain the examination and to approve him for ordination, pending receipt of his credentials from his presbytery of care. After discussion, the motion was approved. The Presbytery welcomed Mr. Bolivar when he was escorted back into the sanctuary. The election of an Administrative Commission, as well as the date, time, and place of his ordination and installation, will be decided at a later date.

Ruling elder Charlie Smith presented the report of the Committee on Ministry. Ms. Lorrie Coonie is being called to serve part-time as the pastor of New Hope Church in Parish. The Rev. Nick Preuninger was approved to serve Immanuel UMC in Camillus, and will be received as a member of our Presbytery. Ruling elder Smith reported on the Boundaries Awareness Workshop that was held in Binghamton, NY on May 7, 2014. The terms of call of the Skaneateles Church

to Mario Bolivar to serve full-time as their Associate Pastor, beginning July 6, 2014, have been approved by COM, and are as follows:

The committee attests that the PNC conformed to AAEEEO guidelines in their search.

Howard Rose was asked to report on the Elmwood congregation and their decision to sell their church building. There is a potential buyer interested in the property, and negotiations are in process to hopefully conclude the sale. Charlie reminded all teaching elders that annual terms of call need to be reported to the Stated Clerk, who will pass the information to COM and will published after the Committee has reviewed them. The Presbytery approved the list of teaching elder classifications as of December 31, 2013, and they are included as Appendix B to these minutes.

Teaching elder Allison Seed was introduced to the Presbytery. She gave her presentation as our regional representative of the Board of Pensions. The Board approved a 4.6% increase in accrued pension credits. She discussed the new Call to Health program. Participants in this program will see their 2015 medical deductible reduced to 1%, rather than the planned increase to 1.5%. One can enroll in Call to Health by doing a few of the following items: Health Assessment (online), annual physical exam, eye exam, cease smoking, attend CREDO if invited. She also highlighted the dues changes taking effect in 2015.

Teaching elder Steve Plank presented the report of the Stated Clerk/Communicator, which included the following items...

1. All previous correspondence received on behalf of the Presbytery has been assigned, referred, or answered. The following additional pieces of correspondence have been received:

- a. Irene Simmons, mother of teaching elder Caroline Simmons (Westminster, Syracuse) died on May 13, 2014. Our prayers are with Caroline and her family at this time.
 - b. The Rev. Harold Wheat, who is being reassigned by his United Methodist bishop and will be leaving his pastorate at First United Church of East Syracuse, wrote a note to the Presbytery expressing how much he has “appreciated your ministry and your welcome” from the Presbytery while he was serving in our midst. He concluded his note by saying that he will “remember fondly my brief time as a Presbyterian.” We pray for God’s blessings to be with Harold and with the East Syracuse congregation during their respective transitions.
 - c. Teaching elder Deb Thomas wrote a note to tell us that her daughter-in-law, Lisa, was in a very serious car accident, and their concern was compounded by the fact that Lisa is pregnant. Our prayers are with Lisa, Deb, and their families during this time.
2. There are several “annual things” that I need to do and report:
- a. It is to be noted for the record that this meeting, as the first stated meeting of the year, constitutes the annual corporate meeting of the Presbytery. There is no business of a strictly corporate nature that needs to come before us, but the minutes need to record that the annual meeting of the corporation was held as required.
 - b. I am required to report to the Presbytery at its first stated meeting of the year the location of stored minutes.

The Presbyterian Historical Society has the following minutes on deposit from the Presbytery of Cayuga-Syracuse:

- c. I am required to report annually to Presbytery the names of former members of the Permanent Judicial Commission whose terms have expired within the last six years (arranged alphabetically within classes, beginning with the most recent class):

Class of 2011: Ruling elder Tania Anderson (Onondaga Hill)

Class of 2008: Ruling elder Natalie Miner (Elmwood), teaching elder Edgar Thornburg

3. Identification cards for teaching elders and commissioned ruling elders for 2014 are available at today's meeting.
4. I occasionally am asked to write an interpretation about Church law and/or Constitutional issues that arise. I wrote one such interpretation on October 14, 2013 regarding questions concerning the property of the former First Presbyterian Church United of Syracuse, New York, in which I explained the rationale needed to establish the Presbytery of Cayuga-Syracuse as the legal owner of the property, along with all other real and tangible assets, and that the Presbytery therefore has the authority to sell the property as it best determines.
5. One of the key principles of Presbyterian church polity is to have equal numbers of teaching and ruling elders in all councils above the session. For this reason I am required to report annually to Presbytery any imbalance between the number of resident teaching elders on the roll of Presbytery and the number of ruling elders who are entitled to vote at Presbytery meetings, so that adjustments can be made if necessary to maintain the parity of teaching and ruling elders at Presbytery meetings (G-3.0301). The following are the numbers of which we need to be aware in this matter (as of December 31, 2013):

One ruling elder commissioner from each congregation (including Isaiah's Table)	= 39

Since the number of teaching elder members is less than the number of eligible ruling elder commissioners, there is no need to redress an imbalance.

Teaching elder Bill Grossman pointed to a previous policy of the Presbytery that specified a different way of figuring the balance between teaching and ruling elders. The Stated Clerk will find that policy and adopt it for reporting the balance next year.

6. The report of the Session minutes and records reviews that were held in October and November 2013 are included as Appendix C to the minutes of this meeting.

The report of the Stated Clerk/Communicator was approved as presented.

Teaching elder Earl Arnold made an announcement about the Young Adult Volunteer program of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), and specifically about his visit to the YAV site in South Korea.

The Presbytery recessed for lunch.

After lunch, the Presbytery reconvened. Teaching elder Pete Shidemantle, chairperson of the Leadership Team, led the Presbytery through the Leadership Team's report. The following items were reported to the Presbytery:

Since the October 30, 2013 Stated Meeting of the Presbytery, the Leadership Team has held meetings on November 12, 2013, and January 16, February 4, March 11, April 8, and May 6, 2014.

Actions taken on behalf of the Presbytery on November 12, 2013:

A-1 Approved a request from the Session of Northminster Church that accumulated interest on their loan from the Presbytery be applied to their current per capita apportionment. (Northminster has paid their loan in full.)

A-2 Approved the annual contract between teaching elder Sandy Sanderson and the Session of the Taunton Memorial Church for his services as Stated Supply, serving 50% time, as follows:

- A-4 Approved the Ministry Information Form (MIF) for the Skaneateles' church's search for an Associate Pastor.
- A-5 Called a special meeting of the Presbytery to be held on Saturday, February 1, 2014, to discuss and vote on overtures being proposed for General Assembly.
- A-6 Appointed ruling elders Sharye Skinner and Gordie Howard as members from the Leadership Team to serve on a special committee to decide how best and most faithfully to use \$350,000 of Presbytery assets to assist our member churches in fulfilling the Great Commission.
- A-7 Set the next Stated Meeting of the Presbytery for Saturday, May 17, at either the Otisco or Marcellus church.

Actions taken on behalf of the Presbytery on January 16, 2014:

- A-8 Appointed teaching elder Karen Green to chair the task force being formed to assist churches by utilizing Presbytery resources.
- A-9 Approved the Stated Clerk's recommendation that the COM chairperson also be authorized to do the matching process for PNC's that are in the search process.
- A-10 Appointed Pete Shidemantle and Steve Plank to write the article about the Presbytery for inclusion in the 2015 *Mission Yearbook for Prayer and Study*.
- A-11 Approved COM's appointment of a Transition Team to work with the Elmwood church at their request: Frank McDowell, Tim Fay, Andrew McTyre, Bill Grossman, Karen McDonough, Shawn Reyburn, and Sharye Skinner.
- A-12 Approved the contract between teaching elder Deb Thomas and the session of the Westernville Presbyterian Church in Utica Presbytery, to serve as their interim pastor, with the following terms:

- A-13 Added the Rev. Colleen Preuninger to the Pulpit Supply list.
- A-14 Approved a contract for teaching elder Virginia Smith to serve as Parish Associate at the Marcellus Church, without remuneration.
- A-15 Approved the ending of the temporary supply relationship between the Session of the Parish: New Hope church and teaching elder Dan McCollister.

Actions taken on behalf of the Presbytery on February 4, 2014:

- A-16 Received the report of the sale of the Lysander property, as follows:
On the 17th day of January, 2014, the Presbytery of Cayuga-Syracuse sold to Richard Whitney of 110 Clarewood Drive, Baldwinsville, NY 13027, for a price of \$1,000.00, property defined as:
 - All that tract of parcel of land, situate in the Town of Lysander, County of Onondaga and State of New York, and being a part of Great Lot Number Sixty-eight in said Town, and bounded as follows: beginning at the northwest corner of States Hundred, thence east on the north line of States Hundred to land deeded to Widow Belfied and Hannah Palmer, thence south on their line to land deeded to Watson or Gott, thence west on their line to the west line of the States Hundred, thence north on said line to the place of beginning. Supposed to contain about ten acres of land, be the same more or less. Excepting and reserving therefrom the premises conveyed by Edward B. Giddings, as Executor of the Estate of Fay N. Giddings to County of Onondaga, by deed dates June 17, 1974 and recorded in the Onondaga County Clerk's Office on July 23, 1974 in Book 2534 at Page 789. Also excepting and reserving therefrom the premises conveyed by the Presbytery of Cayuga-Syracuse to the town of Lysander by Bargain and Sale Deed dates March 19, 1999 and recorded in the Onondaga County Clerk's Office on March 30, 1999 in Book 4310 at Page 315.
- A-17 Referred to the Finance and Property Work Group the request from the Session of Auburn, First church to authorize a \$30,000 loan to the church for the Ministro Ministries at Case Mansion, if the way be clear.

Actions taken on behalf of the Presbytery on March 11, 2014:

- A-18 Approved placing the \$1,000 bequest to First Presbyterian Church United for their work with children and youth, which has been received by the Presbytery, in the Presbytery's general fund to support the presbytery's general needs, which in 2014 includes Triennium and Vanderkamp.
- A-19 Approved the 2012 Audit Report.
- A-20 Approved a job description for the Treasurer that had been crafted by the Finance and Property Work Group.

Actions taken on behalf of the Presbytery on April 8, 2014:

- A-21 Approved the change of location for the May 17, 2014 Presbytery meeting to the Marcellus Church.
- A-22 Approved \$800 for each of the Overture Advocates that we are sending to this year's General Assembly. Rita Hooper and Earl Arnold have agreed to serve as our Overture Advocates.

Actions taken on behalf of the Presbytery on May 6, 2014:

- A-23 Decided that the Committee on Preparation for Ministry will administer the Faye Giddings Fund.
- A-24 Decided that the Benevolent Care Fund, used to support work with older adult ministries, will be administrated by a sub-group of the Leadership Team.
- A-25 Approved the Finance and Property decision to transfer approximately \$1,100 from a trust that was established at FPCU to Park Central church, at the request of the family that established the trust originally.

Recommendations to the Presbytery:

- R-1 That the Standing Rules be amended to change the term of the Treasurer from five years to three years, as follows:
 - 4.040 “The Treasurer shall be elected for a ~~five (5)~~ **three (3)** year term...”
- R-2 That the Standing Rules be amended as follows:
 - To add 6.051e: “Following the presentation of the annual budget by the Leadership Team, and a full opportunity to discuss the budget, the Presbytery shall be responsible to approve the final budget.”
 - To add 6.051f: “Realizing that needs emerge throughout the year in unexpected areas or ways, a certain amount of budgetary flexibility is required to address changes that might be needed. Therefore, the Leadership Team may make changes it deems necessary within the constraints of the overall budget total approved by the Presbytery for the budget. If proposed changes exceed the budget total that was approved, those changes may only be made by approval of the Presbytery itself.”

Note:

The Leadership Team received another proposed amendment to the Presbytery's Bylaws, and brings it to the Presbytery according to the Standing Rules:

To add 6.051e: “The Presbytery as a whole, following the presentation of the Budget by the Leadership Team, and a full opportunity to discuss the Budget, shall be responsible for the vote to approve the budget.

After discussion, recommendation R-1 was approved. After discussion, recommendation R-2 was approved as submitted.

Ruling elder Gordie Howard gave the financial report as chair of the Finance and Property Work Group. He reported on recent properties that have been sold. The property of the former First Presbyterian Church United has been sold, and they are in the process of determining exactly what funds will be realized and fulfilling the Presbytery's decisions on what to do with those assets. The Work Group is back in discussion with the AME Zion Church about

their interest in buying the property of the former Calvary Presbyterian Church in Auburn, as directed by previous Presbytery action. The Work Group has been working in partnership with the Human Resources Work Group to review the position description of the Bookkeeper. The 2012 audit has been completed and reviewed by the Work Group. They are working on a formal investment policy for the Presbytery. They have authorized an audit for 2013. They are in the process of beginning to develop the 2015 presbytery budget.

Teaching elder Karen Green has been chairing the Great Commission Funds Task Force, working on how best to utilize some of the financial resources of the Presbytery to help congregations fulfill the Great Commission. The goal is to engage the Presbytery in a process to help determine how best to do this. A question was raised about the source of the \$350,000 set aside for this purpose. Gordie Howard clarified that there is \$350,000 available in addition to monies realized from the sale of the FPCU property.

Pete Shidemantle concluded the report of the Leadership Team by commending to the Presbytery people's considerations of serving on any of the many Work Groups of the Leadership Team.

Teaching elder Bob French presented the Nominating Committee report, as follows:

Other good news items were shared from the congregations of Pebble Hill, King Ferry, Skaneateles, Park Central, Collamer, and about the Presbytery itself. Ruling elder Charlie Smith shared news about things that are going on in the Synod of the Northeast.

The meeting of the Presbytery was adjourned with prayer by the Moderator at 2:10 p.m.
